The Center for Wound Healing Hyperbaric oxygen therapy

Our Center for Wound Healing is the only facility within seven counties to offer comprehensive, individualized care for patients with chronic, non-healing wounds caused by diabetes, circulatory diseases, radiation burns, or other factors. A compassionate, highly-skilled team of doctors and nurses work with the newest technology to treat such wounds. Hyperbaric oxygen therapy — which greatly strengthens the healing process with pure oxygen at greater than normal atmospheric pressures — is one of them. Other services available are debridement, transcutaneous oxygen monitoring, specialized dressings and wraps, bio-engineered tissue substitutes, and platelet growth technologies.



A recently introduced **Hospitalist** program allows our primary care physicians to spend more time seeing patients in their offices. A Hospitalist is a doctor who only practices in the hospital, and is there to help the primary care physicians. If you need to be admitted to our hospital, your doctor may work with a Hospitalist to give you the best attention and medical care possible.

A Hospitalist keeps a close eye on you as long as you are in the hospital and is readily available to answer any questions you and your family might have. This is one of the newest and most rapidly growing forms of medical care in the United States—and it's right here at Knox Community Hospital.

Hospital, was directed to the purchase of a Digital Mammography machine.


